AAC Assessment Process

Team Meeting 1

This meeting is with the client's team (family, therapy team/s, other stakeholders), to discuss the client's communication strengths and needs. We can decide at this meeting what communication system could be trialled. A device (Ipad) preloaded with communication apps is available for loan, or communication apps can be loaded on family ipads if preferred, or for longer trials. If this is a straight forward assessment, we can select the apps to trial at this stage and leave the device with family for a few weeks. For more complex assessments we can set up and personalise trial systems for the client. Our team follows the SETT framework for assessments.

Supplementary apps

Consider whether other assistive technology apps could also support the young person. We have successfully received funding for scheduling apps and social story apps in the past.

Trial Reviews (by phone or zoom or in person)

Regular check ins at predetermined times to see how the trial is proceeding, and any barriers experienced. If the initial system trial has been successful the family make elect to not trial other apps.

Team Meeting 2

This meeting is with the client's team (family, therapy team/s, other stakeholders), to discuss trial outcomes and identify the system that has best met the client's needs.

Report Writing and On Line Application

Our team will write up an assessment report and submit this on line to the funder, and complete other process requirements.

Funding Outcome

Once we have been advised of funding outcome we will advise the team by Email. Personalisation requests to be submitted by the team so the device can be set up for the client once collected.

Device Delivery

If funding is approved, the device is sent to Talklink South for setup. They contact the assessor to advise when the device is ready for collection.

Team Meeting 3

The family and therapy team meet for device handover. This meeting will help provide information on care maintenance, repairs, and training and other housekeeping. The client may then be discharged from Speech Language Therapy Christchurch back to their own therapy team. Additional help and training will be available if required.

Recommendations

That the family has a separate device for modelling – a second hand ipad can be a good option for this. You can load the funded communication app on up to 5 devices.

Families should enrol with Talklink and complete their free on line training opportunities prior to the trial so they can best support their young person.
